# **BRIEF ACTIVITY OUTLINE:**

Pupils learn to identify what a peregrine falcon looks like by exploring key features and thinking about how it has adapted to survive.



## **SETTING THE SCENE:**

Encourage the children to look carefully at the picture of the peregrines on the powerpoint or activity sheet.

- What features of the bird can they identify?
- Which features stand out the most and why?



### **RUNNING THE ACTIVITY:**

When the children are familiar with some of the features, ask them to draw a picture of a peregrine and label it by writing words and phrases to point out each of its adaptations. You could differentiate by using a printed picture of a peregrine to add the labels to.



#### **EXTENSION ACTIVITIES:**

- Exploring the difference in size between male and female peregrines.

  Females are a third bigger than male birds, enabling them to take larger species of prey and so reduce the competition for food between them.
- Compare the features of a peregrine to those of other birds.
