WEBCAMS



Did you know that every spring you can watch the Derby peregrines on our very own webcams? Our cameras follow them 24 hours a day and you can watch them laying their eggs, see the chicks hatching and follow every step of the way as the chicks grow up and get ready to leave the nest. In the past some schools have built the webcams into their daily routine, watching them for ten minutes at the start of the day then building what they have seen into their lessons.

Here are some great ideas classes to get the webcams involved in your lessons:

- Create a diary each week about how the peregrine are progressing.
- Look at the live webcams and the blog posts to gain any ideas.
- Document the life cycle of the chicks. Get the children to watch them on the webcams and draw them in each stage.
- Create a class poll with all students to guess the day the eggs hatch. Add your class vote to the webcam comments. You could even have a class poll on when they will fledge after they have hatched.
- Look at how many people have viewed the webcams. Do different calculations to determine how much the webcam counter has gone up (addition, percentages, subtraction).
- Create a line graph as a class using the webcam counters to show how many people are watching, this could be added to each day or week. We have had over 250,000 counts in the past! You will need graph paper, a ruler and a pencil.
