#### Where we are now

Derbyshire Wildlife Trust has doubled in size over the past five years and we have substantially increased our influence and impact. However, we are in the midst of a Biodiversity Crisis - a Climate Crisis. Wildlife continues to rapidly decline despite our best efforts and there is a growing disconnect between people and nature. Right now we are in the middle of another crisis - COVID 19. We need to ensure that out of this crisis comes a new normal, one which better enables nature's recovery and which in turn supports wider recovery.

Business as usual is not an option. The next five years are critical.

### Where we are going

Our core purpose is to lead Nature's Recovery. We will be increasingly bold, brave and imaginative. But we cannot do this by ourselves. We will need to empower, support and learn from others more than ever before and we need to improve our resilience.

We strongly believe everyone has a role to play in Nature's Recovery. We will work together with communities, local authorities, businesses, landowners and organisations, supporting them to play their part.

New and exciting opportunities will be developed to enable everyone to notice and connect with wildlife

### How we are going to get there

We will deliver our vision by continually exploring alternative models to meet our aims and by instilling an agile and adaptive culture.

We will deliver our mission by taking forward detailed actions linked to four main strategic objectives:

- Lead Nature's Recovery
- 2 Inspire People to Notice and Care
- **3** Mobilise People and Communities to Act
- 4 Ensure an Agile and Influential Culture

We will run the Trust effectively, setting and measuring performance against targets. We will ensure our staff, supporters and volunteers are motivated, rewarded and have the right skills. We will encourage an agile and ambitious culture and enhance opportunities to enable us to be ever more diverse, relevant and resilient.

We will demonstrate leadership by substantially reducing our carbon footprint and ensuring we are carbon positive by 2025, as well as encouraging and supporting others to do the same.

We will work more closely than ever before with existing and new partners, individuals and communities to ensure we collectively achieve a Wilder Future.





#### Lead Nature's Recovery

We will work in partnership with others to develop exciting landscape scale programmes across our six Nature Recovery areas, working closely with partners and landowners to deliver innovative nature-based solutions to address both the biodiversity crisis and the climate crisis and ensure a Wilder Future. We will also use these initiatives to demonstrate the benefits of a nature-based economy.

Our Nature Reserves will play a key role in Nature's Recovery and we will harness every opportunity to connect our nature reserves into the wider landscape.

Most importantly, we will work together with partners, communities, individuals and landowners to develop exciting Rewilding initiatives across Derbyshire, and we will develop and implement plans for the re-introduction of keystone species such as beavers, pine martens, red squirrels and osprey.

We will be bolder than ever before, substantially increasing our advocacy and influence. We will build on our strong and growing reputation for standing up for wildlife. We will also ensure any new developments deliver genuine net gain for wildlife and support Nature's Recovery.

We will constantly seek new and innovative sources of funding, including grants, foundations, high-value donors, businesses, eco-consultancy work, crowd funding, campaigning and individual giving.



### Inspire people to care

We strongly believe that the natural world should be an integral part of everyone's life. We will therefore work more inclusively and collaboratively than ever before to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to notice and connect with nature, wherever they live, thereby improving health and wellbeing as well as connecting more people to nature to ensure Nature's Recovery.


We will work in partnership with others to establish nature gateways and wilder public spaces to enable new and existing audiences to enjoy and connect

with wildlife and wild spaces, removing barriers to access and inspiring curiosity and connection. We will ensure we have at least one gateway site in each of our six landscape areas, targeting a specific new audience and facilitating place-making. We will also continue to develop a programme of activities through social prescribing schemes developing new and innovative partnerships and novel ways of bringing nature into people's lives.

We will ensure stronger connections to nature by moving from one-off experiences and events to long-term intervention programmes, developed and delivered in partnership with a wide range of local community groups and networks.

We will increasingly tailor our messaging and communications to individual audiences and we will work with others to develop and implement schemes for accredited wild schools, wild gardens, wild farms & wild businesses.







#### Delivering our strategy

We will concentrate our resources on delivering our strategic priorities. Our objectives and strategic priorities will be delivered through a series of annual business plans which will include specific, measurable, attainable, relevant and time-bound targets and will set out the changes, systems and structures needed to deliver our vision.

The business plans will be revised, updated and agreed at the beginning of each financial year, and progress will be documented every two months.

The business plans will inform both the departmental plans and the individual action plans and personal development plans for every staff member.

We will ensure the organisation is held to account through excellent and diverse governance.

### Monitoring progress

Our Board of Trustees will monitor progress and ensure that performance against agreed targets is recorded and analysed every six months.
